Ramos Jr., because an maw-ot niya sa salud, mao man an maw-ot ko nan pag-urupod ko ... nagkaparareho an saamo kamaw-otan and we were able to come up with this program, implement through counterparting scheme and we've done it with flying colors, don't you believe so? This is also our entry to the Galing Pook's good governance on health.

4. **2018 Bronze Awardee on Brigada Eskwela**, we have given the most to our children's education from Early Childhood to the Tertiary Level to OSYs through TESDA/DOLE Technical Schools (one of the reasons why we are ranked 2nd in Sorsogon as Child Friendly Municipality for 2 consecutive years) but technically we didn't reached the silver or gold award for the simple reason that in our SB Resolution the amount was not spelled out which I explained to the DepEd Division during the ManCom last December 2018 held at Villa Isabel in Sorsogon City that we will never put an amount because it will hinder us from giving more to the schools as we will follow and implement what is stated in the SB Resolution. We give accordingly to the present needs, and that is the main reason. The amount disbursed in one school year can be certified through our accounting office and the treasury acknowledged by the recipient schools in our municipality which the DepEd will look into for consideration. The total disbursed amount to schools for CY 2018 amounted to Php3,240,411.02.

To further boost that our support to education is not only on bronze level are the following:

4.1 ECCD/DCC – We have upgraded our Day Care Centers and some others are converted to Early Childhood Development Centers. Out of the 47DCCs, we have now upgraded 10 to ECCDs. ECCD Teachers were trained to impart the best to our children during the most important early years of their learnings. Facilities were rehabilitated including the visual aids which is a must tool in the learning process.

In almost every contest joined by our students from elementary to college, be it in academics, extra-curricular as in scouting and sports, we are always in support to the best that we can but sometimes we also run out of budget, my apologies. (Here in LGU, we are always following the right process, kun naubos na an budget for assistance as cases do happen, we will ask for re-

alignment/re-programming and SB approval before we can implement again, the gap in time is being resolved by right projection but sometimes naaalangan talaga because of high demands specially on AICS, hoping for your understanding kun natamaan kamo san oras na ini.)

When we talk about trade and industry we practically mean the MARKET, the major contributor of our local revenue that was totally destroyed by fire in June 2014 with several establishments scattered unplanned within the market vicinity (maramukon), wet sections were within the street of Zulueta with no drainage, no water, no roofing but all foul odours everywhere (very unsanitary) ... the first phase of the market was on a stop construction status for so many reasons with local revenue at its lowest (down na down an saato ekonomiya) mao po ini an pagsulod namo in July of 2016 as the newly elected officials of Gubat .. a real challenge to all of us. We made a way, out-sourced, re-aligned, re-programmed local funds, we were able to finish the phase 1 of the market in August of 2017 and we were able to let the wet section transfer and the vegetable/fruit section in placed, clearing the streets of Zulueta and Roxas. Now the C-shaped building of the market is under construction with funds out-sourced from the following:

- LGU-Gubat Fund Php27M
- from Sen. Chiz Escudero Php17M
- from Coop-Natco Rep. Bravo Php 8M
- from LGU through MDFO Php49M

Under trade and industry, we have strengthened the agriculture and fishery which also includes livestock and poultry production, regulatory concerns on crab industry and agri/aqua-based livelihood support to our interested clienteles. Along with this, we also equipped our labor-force with TESDA and DOLE training to improve their skills with several programs undertaken.

Thus, as DPWH planned and approved, it will be delivered to us per program. To all who had been instrumental in ensuring the realization of this project ... salamatonon.
